CODE OF ETHICS

All members of the Pennine and Scottish French bulldog Association undertake to abide by its general code of ethics.

<u>Club Members :</u>

- 1. Will properly house, feed, water and exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if and when required.
- 2. Will agree, without reservation, that any veterinary surgeon who performs an operation on any of their dogs, which alters the conformation of the animal, or who carries out a caesarian section on a bitch, may report such operations to The Kennel Club.
- 3. Will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the breed standard should be placed in suitable homes.
- 4. Will abide by all aspects of The Animal Welfare Act.
- 5. Will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally.
- 6. Will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which could be in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed.
- 7. Will not intentionally breed, or promote the breeding of Kennel Club non-recognised coloured French bulldogs.
- 8. Will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties.
- 9. Will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home.
- 10. Will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited.
- 11. Will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life and will help with the re-homing of a dog if the initial circumstances change.
- 12. Will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home.
- 13. Will not sell any dogs to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly, or indirectly, allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind.
- 14. Will not sell by sale or auction any Kennel Club Registration Certificate as stand alone item (not accompanying a dog).
- 15. Will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed.
- 16. Will not falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog.
- 17. Will, when breeding dogs, adopt the principles, requirements and recommendations as embodied in the Kennel Club's Assured Breeders Scheme.
- 18. Will, when placing puppies or adult dogs in a new home, either in the UK or abroad, endeavor to ensure the future well-being of the puppy or dog.
